

Delaware Transportation Secretary Jennifer Cohan and Delaware Transit Corporation (DTC) CEO John Sisson were joined by State

Tourism Director Elizabeth Keller and other state and local officials to celebrate the start of construction on the Maintenance Facility at Lewes Transit Center along DE 1, just south of Five Points on May 21, 2018.

Addressing the crowd, Transportation Secretary Jennifer Cohan said, "This final phase of the Lewes Transit Center allows for sustained operations of much-needed year-round bus service to residents of eastern Sussex County, in addition to the many tourists visiting our fabulous beach communities." She added, "The new Maintenance Facility will house both fixed route and paratransit buses and allow for increased operational efficiencies, as it's closer to a large percentage of our customers."

The three-bay maintenance facility is designed for alternative-fueled vehicles which are cleaner for the environment, including propane for DART's paratransit fleet and eventually electric buses for the regular bus service, is slated for completion next summer. Last May, the Park & Ride at the Lewes Transit Center opened with 248 parking spaces, security cameras, passenger shelters, electric car charging stations, bike racks and repair station.

"The northern location of this transit center is ideal as it offers travelers an option before getting into the heaviest beach traffic. With free parking and frequent bus departures, passengers have a convenient way to get around, and with the dedicated bus lane, you can get to the beach faster than by car," said DTC CEO John Sisson.

The event kicked off the summer tourism season with the startup of DART's daily Beach Bus service, just in time for Memorial Day weekend. Local buses operate frequently from early morning to late night serving Lewes, Rehoboth Boardwalk, Outlets, Long Neck, Millsboro, Georgetown, Dewey, Bethany, Fenwick Island and Ocean City, MD. It also marked the inaugural run of the new Intercounty Route 307, providing weekday express service between Lewes, Milford and Dover, with connections at the Dover Transit Center to Christiana Mall and Wilmington Train Station. Route 305 Beach Connection provides seasonal weekend service from Wilmington, Christiana Mall, Middletown, Dover, Lewes and Rehoboth through Labor Day.

After the Beach Bus service ends on September 9, all Sussex County bus routes will be expanded to include Saturday service, and the two most popular Beach Bus routes (201 – Rehoboth and 204 – Lewes) will continue year round operating every 30 minutes from 7 AM to 11 PM, Monday through Saturday.

"This new facility, along with other improvements at the Lewes Transit Center, are helping to enhance the experience for visitors to Delaware using DART," said Liz Keller, Delaware Tourism Director. "Travelers, who are contributing to the industry's \$3.3 billion impact on the state, will not only be taking advantage of the new transit services during the prime season but will also enjoy the services into the shoulder- and off-seasons that are so important to the area's tourism businesses."

Enhancements at Lewes Transit Center this year include a new Visitor Center to be completed later this summer, providing an air-conditioned passenger waiting area, tourist information, ticket sales and public restrooms. Under the new large canopy, shelters accommodate LCD screens to display real-time bus information, and offer cell phone charging availability. And soon, customers will be able to purchase DART passes on their phones with the launch of mobile fare payment.

Secretary Cohan added, "While we continue to provide convenient transportation options to visitors and residents alike, we further strive to deliver that excellent customer experience."







HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 149th GENERAL ASSEMBLY UPDATE

FROM THE CHAMBER LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATIVE LINCOLN WILLIS. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE . . . As of June 14, 2018

HOUSE AMENDMENT NO.1 TO HOUSE BILL NO.350 SYNOPSIS:

This amendment eliminates "behavioral characteristics" from the definition of "biometric identifier." This amendment includes an exception to the requirement that a person obtain an individual's consent before acquiring, collecting, storing, using or capturing the individual's biometric information is a security purpose. This amendment clarifies that an agency of the Sate or political subdivision of the State includes a law enforcement agency. This amendment adds language inadvertently omitted from the original bill. This amendment deletes the Geolocation Privacy Protection Act.

STATUS: Pulled and not scheduled in committee.

HOUSE SUBSTITUTE NO.1 FOR HOUSE BILL NO.360, AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 19 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES SYNOPSIS:

As poll from 2017 revealed that 31% of people in the United States have been sexually harassed in the workplace. The United States Equal Employment Opportunity Commission released a comprehensive study of workplace harassment in the United States which concluded that between 25% and 85% of women reported having experienced sexual harassment in the workplace. However, the Commission estimated that 75% of all workplace harassment incidents go unreported. The purpose of this bill is to combat sexual harassment in the workplace and to ensure the safety and dignity of all employees in Delaware. This bill defines sexual harassment and makes employers responsible for the sexual harassment of an employee by a supervisor or by another employee when the employer knew or should have known about it and failed to take appropriate corrective action. Moreover, this bill prevents an employer from retaliating against an employee for filing a discrimination charge. This bill includes a requirement that the Department of Labor create an information sheet pertaining to sexual harassment that employers must distribute to employees. Employers having more than 50 or more employees in Delaware will be required to provide sexual harassment training to all employees and supervisory employees, which must be conducted every 2 years. This bill also empowers the Department of Labor to investigate violations of this Act and gives the Department jurisdiction over all sexual harassment cases which include an administrative process. This bill requires the Department of Labor to post the requirements in this bill on its website and perform outreach necessary to educate employers of the requirements. This bill takes effect on January 1, 2019.

CHAMBER STATUS: While the Chamber is not opposed to sexual harassment training and requirements – concerns remain regarding timeline and additional stipulations contained in the bill.

UPDATE STATUS (as of 6/14/18): HB 360 (Sexual Harassment Training) was *not* released from committee. It is unknown if there is time to make all of the changes suggested today and still get it through this session as a new bill would need to be introduced.

HOUSE BILL NO.460, AN ACT PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VIII, § 6 OF THE DELAWARE CONSTITUTION RELATING TO LIMITATIONS ON APPROPRIATIONS SYNOPSIS:

This Act is the first leg of a Constitutional Amendment reflecting the recommendations of the Advisory Panel to the Delaware Economic and Financial Advisory Council (DEFAC) on Potential Fiscal Controls and Budget Smoothing Mechanisms established as per House Joint Resolution 8 of the 149th General Assembly (Panel). This Act would build upon the State's existing appropriation limit methodology by moving the Budget Reserve Account into a newly defined Budget Stabilization Fund, defining rules for deposits to and withdrawals from said Budget Stabilization Fund, and adding a check of the appropriation limit against an index comprised of relevant indicators of growth of the State's economy. The Panel further recommended that any final adoption of the structural budget reforms included in this Act be accompanied by statutory enactment of structural reforms to the Personal Income Tax by broadening the tax base as initially recommended by the DEFAC Advisory Council of Revenues report dated May 2015 and further detailed in the Panel's report dated June 1, 2018.

CHAMBER STATUS: The Chamber supports efforts to secure/save revenues into a stabilization fund.

UPDATE STATUS (as of 6/14/18): HB 460 (Budget Smoothing) was released from committee unanimously. It is expected to be heard on the floor as soon as today or tomorrow.

HOUSE BILL NO.110, AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 16 AND TITLE 30 OF THE DELAWARE CODE CREATING THE DELAWARE MARIJUANA CONTROL ACT SYNOPSIS.

The Delaware Marijuana Control Act regulates and taxes marijuana in the same manner as alcohol. It allows adults over the age of 21 to legally possess and consume under 1 ounce of marijuana for personal use. It does not permit people to grow their own marijuana. CHAMBER STATUS: The Chamber has very strong concerns that the legalization of marijuana in the State would not be in the best interest of tourism, given it can change the demographic, particularly as a family destination.
