Governor Carney Declares State of Emergency to Prepare for Spread of Coronavirus



Governor Carney issued a **State of Emergency declaration** to prepare for the spread of Coronavirus (COVID-19). The State of Emergency directs the Delaware Emergency Management Agency (DEMA) and the Delaware Department of Health & Social Services' Division of Public Health to mobilize state agency resources to assist with Delaware's response to the virus.

The declaration became effective at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, March 13, 2020.

WHAT IT DOES:

- Mobilizes state agency resources to assist with Delaware's response
- Requires the **Delaware National Guard to take** precautionary and responsive actions to assist with DE's response to the coronavirus
- Advises event organizers in DE to cancel nonessential public gatherings of 100 people or more to prevent community spread
- Allows the State of Delaware to conduct public meetings electronically
- Prohibits price gouging during the coronavirus outbreak
