

Potential State & Local Tourism Budget Cuts on the Horizon

TIME SENSITIVE!!! On Tuesday, May 30, 2017, the Delaware Joint Finance Committee (JFC) voted to eliminate the current 1% allocated funding to all State Convention & Visitor Bureaus (CVB's), which is currently a portion of the 8% lodging tax collected by hotels and motels Statewide. This would also terminate the portion of the same 1% which is currently distrib-

uted to all Chambers of Commerce in Sussex County including the Rehoboth Beach-Dewey Beach Chamber of Commerce (RBDBCC). The allocation expenditures to Chambers in Sussex is tied to stringent requirements with regard to marketing expenditures and recorded proof of return on investment.

On Wednesday, May 31, 2017, the RBDBCC Legislative Representative, Mark Lally, as well as several of our tourism partners and Carol Everhart, met at Legislative Hall in the hope that there would be an opportunity to address the JFC. The operating procedure in place did not allow that opportunity. Below you will find a list of the current JFC members. We are seeking your assistance in personally contacting members of the JFC and/or your legislators by phone or in person to seek their support. We did not provide e-mails, as legislators are more receptive to personal contact. If 7 of the 12 member JFC vote in favor, the 1% could be placed back into the budget. The loss of this allocated revenue would, at a minimum, deplete or severely cut the marketing ability for Sussex Chambers, and in some cases, could put them out of business. The effect of this loss for the RBDBCC would result in revenues planned for programs and events to be reassigned to marketing efforts and reduce programs and event opportunities, which is a negative for the business community. **Events in jeopardy would include: Sea Witch® Festival, Sandcastle Contest, Sidewalk Sale, Movies & Bonfires, and Beach Goes Blue...Red & White, Too!** We know this is a complicated issue, so please feel free to contact Carol Everhart (302-227-6446 - office; 302-542-7547 - cell) at any time . . . we need your help.

More buses, running more often

DART Around the Beach and Everywhere This Summer

DART's Resort Transit bus service has gone through a rebranding; now it's known as the Beach Bus service. Part of this effort included giving everything a fresh, eye appealing look, from the bus stop signs to bus schedules to the Park & Ride lots.

'RIIX

In May, DART opened the new Lewes Park & Ride that is located near Five Points, south of DE Route 9. The parking is free, and the cost to ride the bus is \$2 per trip or \$4.20 for a daily pass. It's served by 201, 203, 204, 206 and 305 lines. The Rehoboth Park & Ride, located on Shuttle Road, just off of DE Route 1, north of Rehoboth Avenue is served by 201, 203, 206, 207, 208 and 305 lines. The parking rate is \$10 per day and up to 4 occupants of the vehicle receive a free daily pass that is valid on all Beach Bus routes.

DART's Beach Bus services run daily from approximately 7 AM to 2 AM, with more frequency than ever before, through September 10, 2017. The Beach Bus provides connections to Lewes, Tanger Outlets, Rehoboth Beach and Boardwalk, Dewey Beach, Indian River Campground, Bethany Beach, Fenwick Island, Ocean City, MD, Long Neck, Pot-Nets and Georgetown.

Again this year, DART offers an Employee Discounted Parking Program to your seasonal and year-round staff. Park at the Rehoboth Park & Ride on Shuttle Rd at a discounted rate of \$4 (regular price is \$10) and they'll receive a daily pass, limit 4 per vehicle. For more information, call 226-2001. Hangtags are available for pick up by employers only at the Rehoboth Park & Ride office Monday to Friday 8 AM to 5 PM. Bring a business card or some other type of identification. If you are located and licensed in the City of Rehoboth Beach, employ-



ees may be eligible for a further discount. Call the Rehoboth Beach City Manager's office at 227-4641 for information.

The 305 Beach Connection operates through Labor Day on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. The bus stops at the Wilmington Train Station, Christiana Mall, Odessa Park & Ride in Middletown, Scarborough Road Park & Ride in Dover, the new Lewes Park & Ride and Rehoboth Park & Ride. The fares have been reduced to \$2 per zone ... now the one-way cash fare is \$10 from Wilmington, \$8 from Middletown and \$6 from Dover. Riders are encouraged to buy a 3-Zone Anywhere Pass for \$12.60, which can also be used on all DART Beach Bus routes once at the beach.
