But they had passion for their customers and community, borrowed the money from Farmers Bank and bought the property.



The menu was simple: regular pizza-\$1.50, large pizza-\$2.25 and a party pizza-\$3.75. It was a classic "Mom and Pop" operation. Nick Sr. ran the kitchen and the back of the house and Joan ran the dining room and front of the house. The chef, the one and only for quite a while, started experimenting with new ideas. He had heard about a "twist" they were making in New Jersey and gave it a try. A new menu item was created and has become a local classic. Knowing that something special had been created, he wanted to protect it. A trademark was pursued and in 1975, they got one for the NIC-O-BOLI. For years the chef kept the recipe to himself, protecting his idea. Eventually, he reluctantly taught others.



It's a true family business, with both children pitching in and helping out, either hosting in the front of the house, or managing the back of a new house. This past year, they opened a new location on Rehoboth Avenue, which by all accounts is a tremendous success.

When asked recently what the secret to his success was, he said "instincts". Our business of the year clearly shows that if you use your head and heart to make good decisions, spend little or no time worrying about mistakes, and just keep working hard and moving forward, everything works out for the best.

altruistic efforts for the good and welfare of the community while usually receiving little or no remuneration for their sacrifice and dedication.

Bill and his wife, Rosemarie, refer to their lives together as "an exciting ride". Their personal and professional lives have taken them to many places, but each say there was never a doubt that Rehoboth Beach was the most special place of all and the only place where they wanted to retire.

At the time the Bahans first married, Bill was working for Tufts University. From there Bill spent a few years in the Navy and spent time patrolling the Arctic Ocean on a naval destroyer. Having the opportunity to leave the Navy early, Bill attended the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. While at MIT, Bill attracted the attention of executives at IBM who plucked

him out and offered him a job as a trouble-shooter in the data services division, a position that would take he and his family all over the world. Bill spent nearly two decades with IBM. In 1962, Bill and his family moved to Bermuda as IBM and NASA began working together on the fledgling Mercury space program. His return stateside a few years later brought him to the Washington DC suburb of Bethesda, Maryland. After a successful career with IBM, Bill accepted a position with Control Data Corporation, which later became Arbitron Rating Services. Bill spent 10 years with Arbitron and officially retired in 1990 as Executive Vice President and General Manager of the company.

Bill and Rosemarie and their two young children had been coming to Rehoboth Beach since they first rented a home on Chicago Street in 1967. From 1982 to 1990, the Bahans would spend most weekends and every August in Rehoboth at their beach home on Laurel Street. They've been living there full-time since Bill's retirement in 1990. Having lived such an active and ambitious professional career, Bill was eager to use the next chapter in his life to become an active volunteer. He was appointed by Mayor Sam Cooper to a seat on the City Board of Adjustment – a position he held from 1990-1995. It was also in 1990 when Bill joined the Rehoboth Beach Historical Society and the Rehoboth Art League.

In 2000, Bill became the President of the Historical Society. When he assumed leadership of the organization, there were 55 members and it was extremely difficult to raise money. But Bill worked tirelessly to bring Warren McDonald's dream of a first class Rehoboth Beach museum to life. He spearheaded the purchase of the old Icehouse from its long-time owner Butch McQuaid; he went to the Longwood Foundation and convinced them to give a lead gift of \$100,000, which led to a second \$100,000 gift; and he led efforts to gather artifacts and helped move them into the current museum. During Bill's 14 years as board member and President, the Historical Society's membership doubled, popular programs such as the Beach Ball were established, and more than one million dollars were raised to help realize the dream for the beautiful new museum for our city. Bill also served for 6 years on the board of the Rehoboth Art League. While there, he held the position of Chair of the Buildings and Grounds Committee. According to former Executive Director Nancy Alexander, it was under Bill's leadership when several significant renovation projects were completed, resulting in a more functional and attractive campus. Bill also served as Treasurer of the Art League and did an impressive job of keeping expenses in check while significant fund raising programs were held, allowing the League to flourish.

Though it was the Historical Society and the Art League where Bill volunteered the bulk of his free time, he also served on the Boardwalk Committee and helped negotiate the Comcast Cable contract while chairing the City's Cable Committee. And in 1996, Bill entered the political arena with a run for the Mayor's office. Though unsuccessful in that endeavor, Bill is quick to say that having the opportunity during that campaign to ride his bike around town and meet so many wonderful people was still one of the "great experiences of his life".


The Chamber and community appreciates Bill's efforts to the city and his determination to see so many important projects thru to the end which is what truly set him apart. Bill has made a difference in our community.



International Students Update

Fewer J-1 international student workers available in 2011 because of government rule changes

The U.S. State Department has announced changes to the regulations that govern J-1 Work & Travel USA student workers. Student workers coming from Bulgaria, Russia, Romania, Ukraine, Moldova, and Belarus now require a job offer that has been confirmed by a J-1 Sponsor before their visa interview. This means that there will be fewer J-1 student workers overall coming to the U.S. this year.

Students from these countries make up a significant percent of the seasonal workforce that contributes to Delaware's tourism economy. Employers who rely on J-1 student workers to augment their local staffing during the summer peak season will have to hire much earlier than in past years. If they do not, they will be short staffed. CIEE is urging all employers to make all of their job offers before the end of February and CIEE can help with recruitment. Employers who wait longer to hire will be too late – students won't be walking around looking for jobs as they may have been in the past. (Visit www.ciee.org/hire/newrules for more information.)

Legislative Update - House Bill #28



House Bill #28 – An Act to Amend Title 18 of the Delaware Code Relating to Small Employer Health Insurance – was introduced on January 26, 2011.

A synopsis of the Bill is as follows: This bill enables small employer health insurance carriers to make "stop-loss" insurance coverage available to small employers with more than 15 employees. The issuance of stop-loss coverage to small employers, defined as having no more than 50 employees, will be prohibited as of July 1, 2011. This bill will limit that prohibition to employers with 15 or fewer employees.
